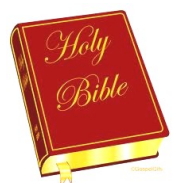
Christmas Eve Service of Carols, Scripture and Candlelight

Caspar's Corner—Schwenkfelder Mission Efforts in 1956

The November/December 1956 *Schwenkfeldian* contains a number of interesting articles of note, among them a delightful mission-message from Rev. Harvey K. Heebner, fifty-year pastor of our Philadelphia Schwenkfelder Church. Rev. Heebner provides an historic framework for presenting a taste of the current mission activities of The Home and Foreign Mission Board of The Schwenkfelder Church in America. His report shows the breadth and depth of a very dynamic program of mission efforts of our churches 60 years ago.

The year 1956 marks the 150th anniversary of the beginning of Foreign Missions in America. In August of the Year 1806, five students at Williams College in Williamstown,

Mass., met in a grove for meditation and prayer concerning the future of the world and their part in it. A sudden storm arose and the downpour hurried them into a neighboring haystack, and there they decided to dedicate their lives to serve people in foreign lands. "We can do it if we will," said Samuel Mills, the moving spirit of the group, and on graduation from the college, a few years later, in 1810, four of the "Brethren," a missionary society started by the Hay-Stack group, applied for service in the foreign field, and this challenge and request led to the formation in 1812 of the American Board with which we have long been associated. This same year the first missionaries from America sailed for India.

Projects of our Schwenkfelder Mission Board, as discovered and reported in our Fall Meeting, September 19 in Norristown reveal many forms of activity: money for lepers; special gifts to our missionaries in America and beyond; help for workers in our Southern mountains, at Hindman and Lucky Fork in Kentucky, Fort Valley, Georgia; supplies of Sun-

day School materials for the Philippines; clothing for Korea; donations to the Blind School of Paoli and for the 5th Street Mission in Philadelphia; garments for Christ's Home, Warminster and Korea; help for the needy in our own Church communities, etc.

The Schwenkfelder Mission Board contributes towards the Far Eastern Joint Office of the American Board of Missions through the Di-

vision of Foreign Missions. It serves 47 mission Boards and Agencies of the U.S. and Canada in Hong Kong, Korea, China, the Philippines, Formosa, Japan, Okinawa and South East Asia. *The China Bulletin*, that some of us receive, shows that the Church in China, is vigorous and going ahead.

Rev. Matias Cuadra held an impressive 10th Anniversary of his new Roosevelt Memorial Church in Manila, the Philippines, and then by letter thanks the Schwenkfelders for sponsoring his education at the Pacific School of Religion, Union Seminary and Columbia University. He is Bishop of a number of Churches in the Islands and is a product and disciple of Dr. Frank Laubach and his literacy work among the Moros in Mindanao. Dr. Laubach being his proctor, induced him to come to America for his education. Rev. Pedro Gonzalez thanks our churches for sending him Sunday School supplies for his district churches. His High School in Mindanao, has an enrollment of 250 this year.

Eleanor Wilson, who addressed a few of our churches this year, is back in the Marshall Islands and finds it hard to get around among the islands without her boat *Morning Star 6* that sunk in a storm. She expects to have another *Star* soon, towards which our Schwenkfelder Mission Board contributed a nice sum.

Dr. J. Maurice Hohlfeld from the Kennedy School of Missions, Hartford Seminary Foundation, Hartford, Conn., attends our Conferences, gave the Historical Sermon on Sept. 24th at Central, and preaches in our churches, thus keeping close contact with our people. His department in the Seminary, Linguistics, in which he is now a full professor, is large and includes students from eight denominations, trained to teach reading to illiterates in their own language, in different lands.

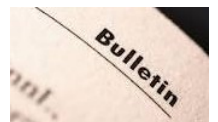

Schwenkfelder Petitions for Tolerance

Presented by Allen Viehmeyer

December 14, 2016 noon

Shortly after the Jesuits began their mission in Harpersdorf to convert the Schwenkfelders to Catholicism, representatives traveled to Vienna, Austria, to plead tolerance from Emperor Charles VI for their Schwenkfelder faith. Descendants of these Schwenkfelders as well as Schwenkfelder scholars have long wondered what arguments these petitions held to persuade the Emperor to terminate the conversion effort. Searches for the original petitions presented to the Emperor in the early 1720s have not brought a single one to light, but copies have been discovered recently in the Schwenkfelder Library & Heritage Center. Come and find out the story of these petitions and what arguments they presented.

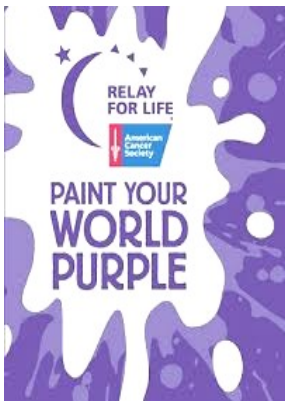
