
## **Annual Report**

## Caspar's Corner — Two Travelers In Silesia

In the October 1912 Schwenkfeldian, Samuel K. Brecht wrote an article about his recent travels to Germany and, especially, into the Silesian homelands with Rev. Elmer E. S. Johnson. We

find another account of this very interesting trip in Rev. Johnson's handwritten diaries, on the pages dated Saturday, July 20 through Thursday, July 25. While the two accounts complement each other, each has a special sound as we hear each man's voice speaking to us in their separate accounts of the same event.

Here are some interesting excerpts regarding the excursions of the two men from Dr. Johnson's diary account:

Saturday, July 20: "This AM I sauntered about Liegnitz [Legnica] ...At 12:58 Brecht arrived from Berlin [on the train]. We immediately went to Geisler [a local store ] & got the wheels [bicycles] @ 1Mk per day for each wheel. We deposited 40 Marks as quarantee. We took [the] 2:14 pm train for Pilgramsdorf [Pielgrzymka], changing cars at Goldberg [Zlotoryja]. Fare 95 pf. x 2 = 1.90 mks. Wheels 60 pf. + 30 tips = 90 pf. [Two] sandwiches @ 30 = 60 pf. 6 postcards 25 pf. We sent our bags with Buntzel [to their nights lodging ] & rode on our wheels into Harpersdorf [Twardocice] ..."

The rest of their day was filled with riding their bicycles, visiting with people Dr. Johnson knew and writing cards to friends back home.

On Sunday, July 21, they started their day with worship in the Lutheran church in Harpersdorf [Twardocice], now lying in ruins, but then served by a young Pastor Goldmann who had just gotten married the week before. Pastor Goldmann "...preached an excellent

sermon on how it was not the external word but the Spirit that must count. Altogether it was a Schwenkfelder sermon." Following church they rode bicycles through the town noting especially "Melchior Dorn's old home", and the former home of "... Caspar Kriebel with CK 1714 over [the] door." After their noon dinner, they pedaled their bicycles through many other small Schwenkfelder vil-

lages throughout the afternoon.

Monday, July 22: "This morning Brecht and I rode our hired wheels... to Gröditzbera [Grodziec]. We left our wheels at the foot of the

mt. for 30 pf. purchased 2 liter cherries for 50 pf. + 10 pf. tip. Climbed to the top and had a fairly good view from the Gröditzberg [Grodziec]. Purchased cards 60 pf. + 10 = 70 pf. paid 20 pf.for the tower [to climb the tower in the castle]

They rode back to Harpersdorf for lunch and then on to the Spitzberg. They climbed the mountain, but a sudden rain sent them down to the restaurant at the base. There they met two local pastors and had deep conversations with them. With the stopping of the rain:

We climbed a second time to the top + there we stood: a Catholic Priest, Protestant pastor of Germany...and two Schwenkfelders, discussing Schwenckfeld history - I doubt if ever before the Spitzberg witnessed " such a scene."

> Tuesday, July 23 was filled with visiting friends of Dr. Johnson in the community. Pastor Goldmann showed them the original map of the Schwenkfelder country in PA of 1767 drawn by David Schultz, This map would eventually be purchased by Dr. Johnson

and come back to Pennsylvania, to the Schwenkfelder Library & Heritage Center collection. Many pictures were taken, acquaintances revived, photographs taken and postcards purchased and written.

Wednesday, July 24: "This AM Brecht and I rode up to the Viehweg and looked at the spot once more — before parting from the place we hold dear we knelt down and thanked our Lord and God for what they did there, asking that we might become more and more established in that faith which endureth."

After checking out of their hotel, they rode their bicycles to Pilgramsdorf [Pielgrzymka] where the caught the 9:54 am train to Liegnitz [Legnica], returned their bicycles, visited friends, toured the city and found accommodation for the night.

Thursday, July 25, their final day together, Johnson took Brecht to Ossig [Osiek], to Schwenckfeld's church and then they parted ways as they each headed home.



Extensive use of original primary source manuscripts will provide the viewer with a survey of ritual applications of prayers and processes used primarily for the healing and protection of humans and their domesticated animals. Images of ritual objects, inscriptions, blessings and procedures will demonstrate the broad-reaching scope of folk customs in Pennsylvania throughout 3 centuries and into the present day.

## Flowers and Bulletins


