
### Youth Sunday




#### Children's Church

#### Caspar's Corner — Harpersdorf History -1826

Siegfried Knörrlich, School Teacher and Music Director in Pre-World War II Harpersdorf, assembled a chronology of Harpersdorf, parts of which are adapted and reprinted here.

1554 Schwenkfelders began to settle in the Harpersdorf area.

1206—Harpersdorf is mentioned for the first time in a document.

1484—The first bells for the church were cast.

1489—Caspar Schwenckfeld was born in Ossig.

1524—The Reformation was introduced to Harpersdorf.

1529—Caspar Schwenckfeld left Silesia for southwestern Germany.

1554—Schwenkfelders began to settle in the Harpersdorf area.

1556—A wandering preacher by the name of Anton roamed through the area preaching Schwenckfeld inspired messages.


1561—Caspar Schwenckfeld died in Ulm, Germany.

1579—through 1597 Sigismund v. Mauschwitz, Lord of Armenruh, persecuted Schwenkfelders.



1719—Jesuit missionaries Milan and Regent arrive in Harpersdorf to convert Schwenkfelders to Catholicism.

1721—through 1727 Schwenkfelders fled Harpersdorf to Saxony where they found refuge in the city of Görlitz and on Zinzendorf's estate in Berthelsdorf.



1724—Baron Otto Conrad von Hohberg, Patron of the Harpersdorf church, had a new bell tower erected with a family crypt underneath. His 25 year old son Hans Ernst, who died of small pox, was the first to be buried in the crypt.

1726—Hardly completed, the new tower and the entire church burned down. The only thing rescued was the baptismal angel, saved from the flames by Pastor Neander, who barely escaped the fire himself.

1727—Sophia Charlotte von Hohberg, the Patroness of the Harpersdorf church paid for the restoration of the church tower from her own resources. The restoration of the entire church was complete on September 14, 1727. The school was rebuilt at the same time.

1732—A Catholic chapel was built with the fines paid by Schwenkfelders for not attending religious instruction.

1733—The Harpersdorf church received a new organ with 1400 pipes.

1735—The Manor House in Lower Harpersdorf was struck by lightening

and burned to the ground.

1740—The small bell of the Harpersdorf church was recast. Emperor Charles VI decreed that all Schwenkfelder must renounce their errors within a year or leave the territory. Their property would go to the Catholic Church

1741—After taking over Lower Silesia, Friedrich the Great, King of Prussia, granted the Schwenkfelders of Silesia religious tolerance and invited the Schwenkfelders who had fled Silesia to return to the homeland, promising restoration of their goods and property.

1826—The last confessing Schwenkfelder in Silesia, Melchior Dorn, a farmer residing in Harpersdorf, died at 73 years, 9 months, and 8 days of age on June 24, 1826.

## TRUSTEES' TIDBITS

- After many phone calls and conversations, the Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that we have found a company to repair and service the Church's sound system. The initial work was completed in May and has made the system much easier to utilize. We did not want to buy a whole new system, and Tony Hersch, from Audiobahn in Pottstown, was able to replace broken components and make additions to greatly improve our sound system.
- New laws that have been passed in the State of Pennsylvania are requiring any employee or volunteer across the State who interacts with children to procure new clearances. This means each individual in Church who is involved with Sunday School, youth choirs, Vacation Bible School, or other youth events must obtain new clearances. The Board of Christian Education, the Moderator, Pastor, and Church Administrator are working on plans for undertaking this requirement. Please be patient and understanding as we work through these new regulations. Thank You.

# MISSION MOMENT: OUR CHURCH'S WIDER MISSION (OCWM)

As an associate member of the United Church of Christ (UCC), Palm Schwenkfelder Church has long supported many of the broad-scale community missions set forth by the UCC organization. One of these far-reaching mission efforts has been Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM). But, what exactly is Our Church's Wider Mission? Simply, it is the use of congregational gifts to meet the mission goals of providing support for local, national, and international community needs. This is typically done through participation in the UCC's "5 for 5" mission offerings, which includes Basic Support, and four special offerings: One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS), Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need, and The Christmas Fund. Palm Schwenkfelder's congregation has been generous in its gifts to most, or all, of these special collections through the years. In further detail, Basic Support provides the funding necessary to support church Conferences and national ministries, including wider and local church ministries, justice and witness ministries, and pension boards. For OGHS, these gifts are used to address international concerns pertaining to emergency and disaster relief efforts, as well as health, education, and agricultural development. Strengthen the Church provides upstart funding to new churches and those building their congregations; also supported are youth ministries, and developing pastoral leadership. The Neighbors in Need offering support justice, advocacy, and compassion through Justice and Witness ministries across the United States, and this includes the Council of American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Lastly, The Christmas Fund supplements pension and health premium funding for low-income retired church workers and clergy. Further to the cause, as a member church of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference (PSEC), these gifts work within the organization to support churches engaging in a pastoral candidate search, offering workshops on various topics, providing grants for students attending seminary, as well as training local churches in financial issues and supporting the efforts of the offices of the PSEC. It is through these gifts, and the missions identified to deliver these gifts, that as a congregation of God we are able to serve the greater majority. In this day and age, these are our demonstrations of faith and service by exclaiming that "God is still speaking!" The late comedienne Gracie Allen gifted the modern world with a profound statement not to be forgotten, "Never place a period where God has placed a comma."
