

Visitors to the Schwenkfelder Library & Heritage Center can gaze upon a very old, slightly rusty looking padlock, somewhat larger than an adult hand and about 2 inches thick with a key 5 inches in length, which is displayed in a small, clear box mounted under the panel depicting Caspar Schwenckfeld becoming a reformer. The label informs visitors that the lock and key come from the Protestant church in the town of Lüben in Silesia (now Lubin in Poland), having

been acquired by Elmer E. S. Johnson. The lock and key supposedly date from the 16th century.

The church was probably the parish church of St. Nicholas in



Lubin, which is located a short distance from Ossig, the site of the Schwenckfeld estate. Very early in the 1520s Schwenckfeld became a lay preacher, bringing the message of the Reformation to many towns and villages. The church in Lubin was one of those churches where he preached occasionally in the pulpit of a priest whom he had converted to the Reformation.

Knowing the significance of this particular church in Schwenckfeld's life, Schwenkfelder descendant and scholar Elmer E. S. Johnson visited Lubin and the parish church in 1905 while on an extended tour of Silesia, visiting Breslau, Liegnitz, Ossig, Goldberg, and many other

Schwenkfelder sites in addition to the ancestral village of Harpersdorf. The following is an excerpt from his diary where Johnson describes his visit to the church and the gift of the padlock and key on Thursday, August 3, 1905.

Then we went to the church of Lüben where Schwenckfeld preached. The castellan [caretaker] who is there for 36 years was very kind in showing the church to us. The church is over 600

years old and is in a fine state of preservation. Indeed it too is as it was in Schwenckfeld's day. I mounted the pulpit with many thoughts running through my mind. I took two pictures of the interíor. The Castellan presented two very old locks to us as mementos both of which were used in the church and run back beyond the days of C.S. the Sacristy is Romanesque and is the oldest part of the church. A very old wooden chest made from one piece of wood, very large and massive and dating from ancient Catholic times is still to be seen in the church. After slipping two Marks into the castellan's hand we went out and photographed the exteríor.

Caspar's Corner is provided monthly to The Schwenkfelder Church by the Schwenkfelder Library & Heritage Center.

Brown Bag Lecture with Allen Viehmeyer



A Visit to Harpersdorf as told by Elmer and Rolland Johnson



On Wednesday November 13th at noon, come to the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center to hear A Visit to Harpersdorf as told by Elmer and Rolland Johnson. The last week of July 1905 was a momen-

tous occasion for Elmer, Agnes, and Rolland Johnson as they visited the ancestral home village of their forefather George Schultz. Johnson spent nearly two weeks in Harpersdorf searching for information about his family in church and legal records. He talked with many local people about the Schwenkfelders, and, of course, he visited the Viehweg burial site. Johnson records his experience and information in his diary, and Agnes, as spokesperson for Rolland, does the same. Hear about their visit through the words they recorded.



Schwenkfelder Life in Pennsylvania before 1780

On Wednesday, December 11th at noon come to the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center to hear Schwenkfelder Life in Pennsylvania Before 1780. Schwenkfelders in eighteenth century Pennsylvania lived a life that was in some ways similar, some ways different than the life they abandoned



in Germany. This illustrated slide lecture looks at a variety of their life experiences and attempts to convey what life among the Pennsylvania Schwenkfelders was like during the colonial period. Some

> of the topics covered are contacts with Silesia, homes, occupations, religious practice and family life.

Pastor's Pause-Lift Every Voice and Sing

On November 3rd we will gather for worship utilizing the All Saints Day texts from the Revised Common Lectionary, and on that Sunday we will sing a song that I have been patiently waiting to introduce here at Palm. Now I know that many of you absolutely love it when we sing completely new hymns (please read with my humorous tone in mind), and I will point out that there is a Pastoral Relations

Meeting immediately following the worship service which was already scheduled (hopefully read with humorous tone in mind once again), but in my Pastor's Pause for this month I wanted to share a little about the hymn we will be learning and singing together. Lift Every



Voice and Sing was written in 1899 by poet, educator, lawyer, and civil rights activist James Weldon Johnson. According to Wikipedia it was actually first read by 500 school children as an introduction for their honored quest, Booker T. Washington, in 1900 celebrating the birthday of President Lincoln. Johnson's brother John would write the music for the hymn in 1905, and the song was copyrighted in 1921. I was first introduced to this hymn sometimes referred to as the African American National Anthem at a gathering for African American students on the UNC campus, and was immediately captured by the power of its words and its persevering melody that continues, even in darkness, to uplift our

souls. Please take a moment now to read and reflect upon this beautifully inspiring poem, and I look forward to lifting our voices together as we sing a new song of our praise to God.

Lift every voice and sing, till earth and Heaven ring, Ring with the harmonies of liberty;

Let our rejoicing rise, high as the listening skies, Let it resound loud as the rolling sea. Sing a song full of the faith

Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us.

Sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us;

Facing the rising sun of our new day begun,

Let us march on till victory is won.

Stony the road we trod, bitter the chastening rod, Felt in the days when hope unborn had died; Yet with a steady beat, have not our weary feet Come to the place for which our fathers sighed? We have come over a way that with tears has been watered;

We have come, treading our path through the blood of the slaughtered;

Out from the gloomy past, till now we stand at last Where the white gleam of our bright star is cast.

God of our weary years, God of our silent tears,




Miller Keystone Blood Drive
