Caspar's Corner—Brotherly Love

“To love everyone for Christ’s sake, to serve everyone as far as possible, to do good to everyone, to the poor most of all, that is brotherly love” – Caspar Schwenckfeld in a letter dated March 1532. [Document 128, vol. 4, *Corpus Schwenckfeldianorum*]

“To love everyone for Christ’s sake, to serve everyone as far as possible, to do good to everyone, to the poor most of all, that is brotherly love”

Helping the poor has been a predominant Christian teaching for some two thousand years. Sincere Christians have practiced this commandment for centuries. There is no doubt that Schwenckfeld, his devotees, and all their spiritual descendants down to today have embraced and acted compassionately towards those in need – whoever they might be; whatever their need

might be.

Schwenckfelder refugees benefitted from the compassion of Dutch Mennonites while they were seeking a safe haven. Thousands of Guilders were collected and sent to Schwenckfelder families living in the refuge of Görlitz in the late 1720s. The story told by Christopher Schultz about the unselfish hospitality of the Byuschanse brothers toward the Schwenckfelders in 1734 by housing and feeding them in Haarlem before their voyage; by generously paying the passage for all 200 Schwenckfelders as well as providing a substantial gift of 224 Reichstaler to establish a charity fund for those in need after arriving in Pennsylvania.

Among the Schwenckfelder refugees in 1734 was Friedrich Schöps. Not much is known about this evident bachelor. The *Genealogical Record* devotes just over thirty words to his life [GR, p. 68]. A little searching through documents in the SLHC reveals a few other traces of this Schwenckfelder immigrant. His last will and testament reveals that he committed himself as early as 1708 to helping persons in

need. Every year he put aside a certain sum of money to dole out to persons in need – even when his own need become great. It seems possible that he continued to do that in Pennsylvania. When he died in 1762 he had no real estate, but specified in his will that all his personal goods be sold and the money given to those in need (Legal wills, VS 13).

There is some evidence that Friedrich Schöps was a friend of the Schwenckfelder medical practitioner Abraham Wagner, a man whose

name might still be recognized today. He died in 1763, a year after

Schöps. Wagner, too, is known today for his compassion for poor and needy people. In his will Wagner bequeathed small amounts of money to his brother and other close friends. In addition, he specified that £20 should be given to the recently established hospital in Philadelphia. Moreover, he bequeathed funds for the purchase of hymnals and testaments, Lutheran and Schwenckfelder, for distribution to those who could not afford to purchase them. Finally, he ordered that 1/3 of his substantial estate be turned into cash. Three custodians were appointed to distribute this cash over a period of several years to anyone found in need.

Caspar Schwenckfeld urged his followers to love and do good to one and all. For centuries Schwenckfeld’s spiritual descendants have taken this admonition to heart. These few stories from the immigration period illustrate the beginnings of the Charity Fund as well as charitable works still being carried on by today’s Schwenckfelders.

**Martin John the Younger: Early Silesian
 Schwenkfelder Leader**



November 9, 2016 noon

On Wednesday, November 9th, come to the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center to hear a presentation by Allen Viehmeyer about Martin John the Younger. This presentation is an introduction to the life and times of Martin John the Younger who lived from 1624 until 1707. John had many interests and talents including writer, publisher, hymnist, beekeeper, and medical practitioner. He is especially known as the author of the first history of the Schwenkfelders and he published a book about beekeeping. He traveled extensively in western Germany, visiting several people with whom he corresponded. His interest in religious faiths other than his own caused some difficulties between him and conservative Schwenkfelders.






Flowers and Bulletins
