Pastor's Pause—Immersed in the Life of Another

My friend and colleague, Rev. Joe Motz, made what I felt was a profound statement in the midst of sharing during a prayer group. In describing why he attended the celebration of life service for Rev. Bob Koenig, he said that he went "to immerse himself in the life of another." Before I had even started my sabbatical, Joe managed to sum up my hopes and desires for it in six words.

Exploring the life and ministry of Dr. John C. Peeler was an opportunity for me to get out of my own life and focus, and in



learning about another to examine my life from a distance, to return to some of my origins, to hear again the call of God in Jesus Christ to ministry.

Immersing ourselves in the life of another is a familiar concept to disciples of Jesus Christ, or at least it should be.


Immersing ourselves in the life of another is a familiar concept to disciples of Jesus Christ, or at least it should be. The two sacraments of the Protestant tradition at their core invite us



to remember and to share in Christ's life, death and resurrection. In baptism we are born of water and the Spirit and claimed as child of God, disciple of Christ, and member of the church. In communion we gather again at the table of Christ to know the bread blessed and broken, the cup poured, and the Church transformed into the body of Christ. In these sacraments we do not lose our identity or individuality, rather we find it and it redefines who we are.

It is a great irony of Christianity, that the more we immerse ourselves in the life of Christ,



Scholarship Awarded



Caspar's Corner—Twentieth Anniversary of Rev. Oscar S. Kriebel's Ministry

On Sunday, October 6, 1912, the Palm Schwenkfelder Church, gathering at the start of their second year in their new church building, taking a whole Sunday, with morning, afternoon and evening services, to celebrate the

twentieth anniversary of the ministry of Rev. Oscar S. Kriebel. This report of that day appeared in the November 1912 issue of *The Schwenkfeldian*, written by Oscar S. Schultz. 102 years later to the month, we bring to you the report of the celebration for a much loved Pastor.

The Twentieth Anniversary of the beginning of Rev. Oscar S. Kriebel's ministry in the Schwenkfelder Church marks a new mile-stone in the history of the Schwenkfelder Church in the Upper District. The Anniversary Exercises were held in the new church at Palm, Pennsyl-

vania, October 6th, beginning at 10 o'clock. Dr. Kriebel preached the sermon in the forenoon. He had expected to have the pastors of the other Schwenkfelder Churches present, but because of their duties in their own churches, they found it impossible to be present in the forenoon. We had a good many of the former members of the church and Sunday School present.

The meeting was continued in the afternoon and evening. In the afternoon we opened with a song service, which was followed by the history of the Sunday School by Oscar S. Schultz. In his paper he referred to the opening of the Sunday School in the Kraussdale Meeting House, on April 8. 1877. We are greatly indebted to Howard W. Kriebel for the material which he has preserved for Sunday School history. We have to bear in mind that Hosensack and Washington did not have a Sunday School at this time; Kraussdale was the only one. On April 13, 1879, a Sunday School was opened at Hosensack and the following year,

May 16, 1880, at Washington. Our Sunday School was working under great difficulties for over thirty years because of the fact that we had Sunday School at one of the three different places only every three weeks. A decided change came about when we took possession of our new church at Palm. A good deal of money and time has gone into this work and we feel that it has been abundantly blessed and we pray that the same progress may con-

tinue in the future.

This paper was followed by the history of the Ladies' Aid Society which was read by the president, Mrs. Joseph K. Schultz. In the afternoon special music was rendered by a chorus led by

Prof. Weirich. Dr. Kriebel had invited several pastors of the neighboring churches to be with us on this occasion. The first one that he called upon to speak in the afternoon was Rev. O. F. Waage, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, of Pennsburg. Rev. Waage is the oldest pastor in this community, having been in the active ministry for forty-four years. He has been with us at different times during the past years. He was one of the first men to welcome Dr. Kriebel into the pastorate when he came back from Germany to begin his work here. He has always remained a good friend to Dr. Kriebel and has alwavs taken a keen interest in our work. Rev. Waage delivered a very fine address which appears in full in another part of this issue. He was followed by Rev. J. L. Roush, pastor of the Reformed Congregation of Sumneytown, Keeler's Church and Old Goshenhoppen. He has taken no less interest in our work and has always been a good friend to our pastor, Dr. Kriebel.

Rev. Roush was followed by a pastor of our own church in the Middle District, Rev. Edwin S. Anders, who touched very strongly upon

the work that Dr. Kriebel has been doing during the past twenty years for the Sunday School and church. Rev. Anders is the only one left of the ministry twenty years ago, and it was a matter of pleasure and gratification to all our members and friends that it was possible for Brother Anders to be with us on this occasion with his family both for the afternoon and evening services and to participate in the exercises. It is to be hoped that Brother Anders may be spared many more years of active and useful service in the ministry of our Schwenkfelder Zion.

the more we find our true selves in the midst of God's gracious love and kingdom. I guess that I should not be surprised that in a culture that tells us "It is all about you" over and over again, that the traditions and heritage of our faith, that tell us "It is not about you" and "It is not all about you" grow unpopular or seem archaic.

There are plenty of congregations that express again and again, and again, that Jesus died for you, and let's thank God that we are saved. There are plenty of pastors in their rhetoric who can't seem to think of anything else to say other than "Jesus died for us sinners. Isn't that great and praise God!" Now, Jesus did die for you and me, and we should thank God that we are saved, and we are called to

praise God, but in the Christian faith we are invited into so much more. We are to immerse ourselves in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, to immerse ourselves in the very splendor of God. We are vessels of the Holy Spirit, children of God, sisters and brothers in Christ. We are the baptized in communion with the Almighty, the redeemed living by grace. And it is that reality which grounds our hope, which lifts us beyond the chaos and grieving that surround us, and leads us deeper into the waters of faith, throughout our history, through these present moments and into God's new day.




