Pastor's Pause—A Global Community

On October 4th, along with Christians throughout the world, we will celebrate World Communion Sunday. It is a day when we remember that Palm Schwenkfelder Church is not just a local congregation, carrying out its own mission, but a part of Christ's global community, carrying out the mission of our Savior. On World Communion Sunday it is particularly appropriate to think about those whom we have encountered and known in distant lands that share with us in the body of Christ.

As we prepare for this year's World Communion, I was reminded of a few moments that we have been able to share, thanks to technology, in the worship life of this congregation. Last year on World Communion Sunday, during the Children's sermon we were able to make a phone call to folks from Palm

who were in Germany and Poland on the Schwenkfelder Heritage Tour. While making that call across the Atlantic, the group shared with us two prayer concerns for members of their group

who had become ill, and we prayed for them together.

This summer we were delighted to have Claudia Skrocki from Poland doing a language immersion program. At

the Meetinghouse service she shared a letter from her father while Facetiming with her parents while they were on vacation in Italy, and the kids received some Polish candy!

I think it is good for us as people of faith to hold those moments of connecting throughout the world close to us. Every World Communion Sunday I find myself also reflecting on my own travels and encounters. The faces of children in Ghana and a walk to a waterfall with a new friend, a conversation with a woman in Togo and a man walking back from fishing utilizing my mostly forgotten years of French, my High School friend Sam Park from Korea and exchange student Henry Hui from China, all of these moments and faces, remind me of a community stretching far beyond the small table we gather

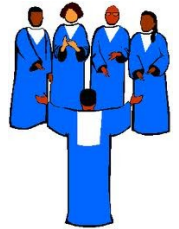

Caspar's Corner—A Distinguished Life of Service

One of the more notable lay persons of The Schwenkfelder Church during the 20th century was Wayne C. Meschter. Upon his death in 1963, the *Schwenkfeldian* committed much space in me-

morializing his many accomplishments. It is well to be reminded of his active role in the life of our church as we continue to serve this church some 50 years after Mr. Meschter's death.

The death of Wayne C. Meschter on January 25, 1963, at his home in Glenside, terminated a long and full life, dedicated in large measure to furthering the interests of the Schwenkfelder Church, as well as numerous other religious

and educational institutions. Mr. Meschter was 79 years of age when he passed away.

While he had relinquished many of his positions in recent years, at the time of his death, Mr. Meschter served as President of the Board of Publication of the Schwenkfelder Church, President of the Schwenkfelder Library Corporation, Secretary of the Schwenkfelder Board of Charity, Treasurer of the Philadelphia Church, a Trustee of Perkiomen School and a member of the Board of Governors of the Society of the Schwenkfeldian Exiles.

A native of Palm, Mr. Meschter took a position as a shipping clerk with American Preserve Company, Philadelphia, becoming sole owner and president of the firm in 1916. He retired from the presidency in 1941. Mr. Meschter served as moderator of the General Conference of the Schwenkfelder Church from 1926 to May, 1958, and was active in denominational organizations for many years. He attended Perkiomen School in 1902 and served on its board of trustees since his election

by the general conference in 1926, remaining as a member of the board until his death. He was presented with the Perkiomen Key, the school's highest alumni award, in June 1939.

During World War II, he served the federal government as a consultant to the War Food Administration, Department of Agriculture, and after the war was active in sending clothing and food to war victims in Silesia and in aiding

other European refugees. His initial grant of

\$100,000 to the Schwenkfelder Board of Publication in 1945 made possible the erection of the Schwenkfelder Library, adjacent to the Perkiomen School campus, to house historical records. The Schwenkfelder Historical Library, founded in 1885, had been located in the Carnegie Library since 1912.

He also played a major role in the printing of the two-volume *Genealogical Record of the Schwenkfelder Families*, by Dr. Samuel K. Brecht, and in the publication of the *Corpus Schwenkfeldianorum*, which traces the history of the Schwenkfelders from the 15th century. He was a former Sunday school superintendent at First Schwenkfelder Church, Philadelphia. Active in community life, he was a former president of the Abington Township School Board, and also a former president of the Abington Parent-Teachers Association.

The honorary degree of Doctor of Laws was conferred on him by Temple University on February 15, 1954. He was founder and first president of the Temple University School of

Business Alumni Association, and long noted for his generous support of the university. He was a member of the Union League of Philadelphia; the Grocers and Importers Exchange; the Pennsylvania German Society; and honorary member of Beta Gamma Sigma, Temple University Chapter. He was also a charter member of Manufacturers' Golf and Country Club, Oreland.

Wayne Clemmer Meschter was born December 18, 1883, at Palm, the son of Charles Y. and Matilda (Clemmer) Meschter. Surviving was his

wife, the former Leila C. Kriebel, whom he married October 16, 1912; four sons, W. Kyrel, and E. Everett, both of Glenside, and twins Spencer K., of North Wales, R.D., and Sherman C., of Philadelphia, and a daughter, Loretta, wife of John Osbourne, of Langhorne. Also surviving was a brother, Charles Meschter, of New York, N. Y., a sister, Mrs. Ida Swingle, also of New York, and 13 grandchildren. The Rev. Harvey K. Heebner, pastor of First Schwenkfelder Church, Philadelphia, of which Mr. Meschter was a member, officiated at services at Palm Schwenkfelder Church at 11 a.m. Tuesday, January 29. Interment was in the adjoining church cemetery. There was no viewing, and in lieu of flowers, it was requested that memorial gifts be sent to the Schwenkfelder Library, Pennsburg.

But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith.

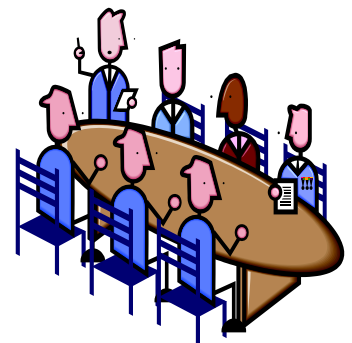

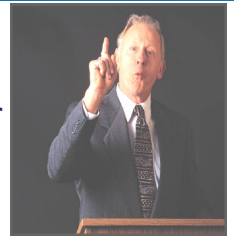

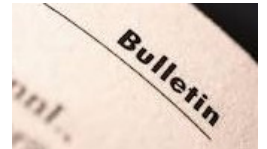

School of Christ

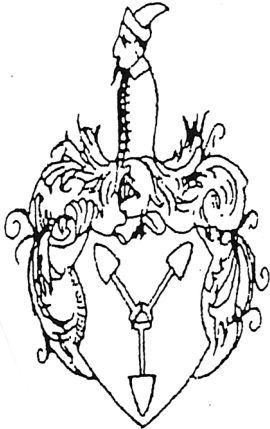

"How does the Holy Spirit lead you when Exiles (Schwenkfelders) meet immigrants"?

Last year's program helped us recognize where and how the Holy Spirit has been with us in our individual lives. This year we would like to talk about the Spirit's leading regarding immigrants: those coming into our society as well as members of our society who leave to enter other societies.



Caspar Schwenckfeld was concerned with the development of a personal Christian lifestyle motivated by the dynamic (today we might say "interactive") indwelling of Christ. The trip is scheduled to run from July 30 through August 7, 2016.

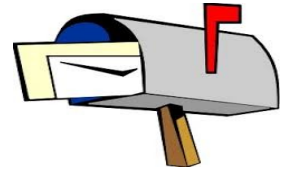

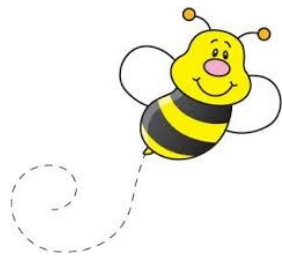
