January 1, 2017

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens..." Ecclesiastes 3:1

At any given moment I can look at three clocks—one on my wrist, one on my computer, one on my cell phone. My grandmother, who couldn't see her watch, could push a button on it and it told her the time. Even at 93 you must know the time.

The cruelest of all clocks is the one at the foot of your hospital bed where you can count every second of your spiraling sickness--or mark the moments on the march to restored health. And that is the question this New Year's Day—in which direction is the march of time leading you?

Ecclesiastes says there is a time for all things. There are inevitable passages of time through which God will lead us. Ponder this New Year's Day-- how will you follow? In the time of war will you go to war or will you pursue peace? In the time of peace, will you go to war over inequalities that offer peace but no justice? In the time of hate, will you hate or will you, as Jesus commanded, Love God and your neighbor? When it is time to die will you die as one who has truly lived?

When Jesus began his ministry in Galilee, he said, "The time is fulfilled." This very moment, January 1, 2017 is rich with divine possibility. We stand between the old and new. The past is not completely finished and gone, but the truly new has come.

For those of us who need a plan with time increments let me offer this one: block out one hour today—for 30 minutes give thanks for all that 2016 was and grieve for that it was not. For the second half-hour dream dreams of all that things that you hope will happen this year—realistic or not. And, finally, list the dreams that you will help along to reality and the ways you will do that.

If you do this, you will have answered both questions. You will know where the march of time is leading you and you will know that you have spent time with the ONE who is leading you and how you will follow.
