January 4, 2015

Message from Rev. William P. Worley, PSEC Conference Minister Tony Robinson reminded me several years ago that the name of this month, "January," comes from the ancient Roman deity, Janus - a lesser god but one who has always made sense to seekers after the heart of the Divine. Janus was the god of gates and doorways. He had two faces, one looking forward, another looking backward. So there is only a little surprise and much gratitude that in Psalm 121 God keeps a particular vigilant watch of our times of "going out and coming in," our times of ending and beginning, and all that is between the two.

Transitions - whether of the calendar or in the seasons of our lives — are crazy-making times. They can be confusing and exhilarating; chaotic and creative. That certainly has been true of our Conference life. We've been through more transitions in the last year than could easily be counted here. That's true of our congregational lives where all of us worship in "the church that has been" feeling anxious about "the church that will be." And it's true of our personal lives where the only constant, to quote the old adage, is change.

But that is not the only constant. When everything else may seem up for grabs or in flux, one thing is not: God's abiding love and presence. "I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me..."

This I know to be true. And it is my prayer for you and all our brothers and sisters in Christ that we move confidently into this New Year holding fast to that which has been good ready to receive what is going to be even better.

Back in 1883, at a meeting held at the public school house, a unanimous decision was reached to build the first church in the village of Perkasie (then not yet incorporated). *The St. Stephen's Reformed Church of Perkasie* was the original name chosen because the Reformed Church is the church of martyrs and St. Stephen was the first martyr. The first church building was dedicated on November 14, 1886. Our Mission Statement says: Our purpose as St. Stephen's United Church of Christ is to respond to God's call as a community of covenant and faith in Jesus Christ; to worship God and celebrate together in the gospel of Jesus Christ; to share in the love and fellowship

of Christ; and to minister loving service to humankind. "Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." (Romans 15:7). Our congregation extends hospitality to all - no matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here.

Children play an active role in the worship services and intergenerational mission programs. Through our ministry and mission we strive to deepen one's understanding and relationship with God and over time transform lives by making disciples of Jesus Christ. We are constantly visioning and working at community building and "faith talking." For the sixth consecutive year, St. Stephen's has participated in Interfaith Hospitality
