Christian Exiles Are Fleeing Persecution

Let's help rescue some Exiles! The Deacons at Palm have arranged a partnership with Church World Service (CWS) that will allow all of us to play a role in solving the problem. We will begin by serving as a Hospitality Team for legal, Christian refugees arriving in our area. CWS is one of nine agencies certified by the US State Department to receive refugees. It is difficult not to be distracted by news reports, but it should be noted that it will be another two years before current Syrian exiles can be expected. Meanwhile, we seek to minister to a Brother or Sister from anywhere in the world who has made it through the process and arrives as a stranger in need. Please watch for announcements polling our congregation for specific needs. In the meantime, please include this mission in your prayers. Ask the Lord to guide us and ask how He wills each of us to participate.

Racial Justice Sunday Message

From Rev. Edward Livingston, Assistant Pastor, Living Water UCC

As I prepare for this Lenten season, I am confronted with economies of exclusion that produce heavy burdens on people throughout the land. While these burdens impact people across the spectrum of society, African Americans and Latinos bear disproportionate hardships that result in high rates of incarceration and death, as well as barriers to health, opportunity and prosperity. For example, African Americans are six times more likely to be arrested and serve more prison time than their white counterparts for the same offenses.¹

Racial Justice Sunday is an appropriate time to fully open us to hear what God is speaking. If we truly listen, we will hear the blood of Tamir Rice, Reika Boyd and so many others crying out from the land. All lives matter...yes, and Black lives matter. Ignoring this deliberate focus invites continued racial injustice. To declare that Black lives matter is a fearless affirmation and a call to action to dismantle systems that destroy the lives of people of African descent.

A 2012 poll revealed that 51% of Americans expressed anti-black sentiments; a 3% increase from 2008.² Yet, we as members of the UCC have hope and believe that God is still speaking. As a united and uniting church, we are called to address the implicit bias³ and racial anxiety⁴ that divides our nation. We are called to lead our country in embracing a radical love that demonstrates the healing and reconciling power of God.

Start with prayer. Acknowledge any fears. Listen to God. Allow the Creator to empower you to help repair our world. The Holy Spirit is able to guide you in being in true relationship with people across racial lines. This is the most effective practice to dismantle the aim of racism and to create Dr. King's "Beloved Community."
