#### **Mission Moment: One Great Hour of Sharing**

In 1946, in an effort to seek relief and reconstruction funds during and following World War II, Bishop Henry Knox Sherrill, the presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church at that time, broadcasted a nationwide challenge to people of faith to raise "one million dollars in one hour," and the challenge was achieved. In 1949, hoping to find the same level of success using the Bishop's fundraising model in the United States for domestic and international disaster and aid relief projects, church leaders representing multiple denominations created a scripted national radio program entitled, "One Great Hour," which debuted on March 26, 1949, and in 1950 the new title, "One Great Hour of Sharing" was used for the first time. Over these many decades, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) has been through many transitions, but the goal of raising funds for disaster relief, development, and humanitarian aid, through special gift offerings to be used around the world has remained an unwavering mission. In 2016, the United Church of Christ received over \$2.2 million for the One Great Hour of Sharing offering. Every dollar was used to help people and communities living in critical situations worldwide. On March 26, 2017, Palm Schwenkfelder Church will participate in the special gift collection for One Great Hour of Sharing, for which this year's theme is, "You are Here." During a time when many in the world are experiencing strife and sorrow, their pleas seeking His comfort and assistance are echoed around the world, as they gaze to the Heavens above and cry aloud where God may be, we know he is near: "The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth," Psalm 148:18.

# Transfiguration Sunday .. "Be yea also ready!"

Our focus on Transfiguration Sunday is usually the dazzling and magnificent activities happening on the mountain, as it should be. It's hard to take your focus off the mountaintop, where Jesus is glowing, Elijah and Moses are present, and Peter is falling asleep. But if your attention is too firmly on the zenith, you might miss something significant in the valley.

Do you remember the movie, *Crimson Tide*? Denzel Washington is the young executive officer (EO) on a nuclear submarine where Gene Hackman is the seasoned captain. A fire breaks out in the mess hall (galley) and while Denzel goes to put out the fire, the old Captain decides to run a test of the nuclear launch response system. The young, rising, EO is very upset; why run a test right now, when no one expects it or is prepared?

During Transfiguration there is a test occurring. Down in the valley the remaining 9 disciples are tested by a man who brings his son for healing. This is a pop quiz, and yes, God gives pop quizzes. Sure, if we had it our way God would only test us when we are prepared, studied, and warned. In my academic life, the class where I learned how to study was physics and a teacher who firmly believed in pop quizzes. That class taught me to be a constant learner and not just a "test taking learner." In our spiritual lives the lessons are continuous, and likewise are the test, but as my great-grandmother would warn, "Be yea also ready!"
