UCC Women's Week

The United Church of Christ has designated March 1-7 as Women's Week. It is no happenstance that World Day of Prayer (March 6) falls within this week, as it is a global ecumenical movement of Christian women joined together to observe a common day of prayer each year on the first Friday of March. The World Day of Prayer International Committee motto is "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action." This reflects the truth that prayer and action are inseparable. There are quite a number of ecumenical World Day of Prayer gatherings within the bounds of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference, and I would encourage everyone - men and/ or women who are able - to attend one of these events!

In this UCC Women's Week, I am also reminded of special women in my life who have mentored me and who have shared their wisdom and insights with me over the years. In May, 2013, I had the privilege of meeting one such woman who was celebrating her 65th Ordination Anniversary as the first woman ordained by the Evangelical and Reformed Church, Rev. Beatrice Weaver McConnell. I enjoyed sitting with Rev. McConnell at an Alumni luncheon sponsored by Lancaster Theological Seminary –what a gift!

Rev. McConnell was (and is) a woman of courage, a woman of character, a woman of deep faith, and a woman of determination. And though I only spent a brief time with her, I experienced many blessings she shared with all of us who have followed her in saying, "yes," to a call to ordained ministry. Lancaster Seminary has produced a brief video interview with Rev. McConnell in which she shares insightful recollections from her spiritual journey. I'd recommend it to all who have interest in the ways God calls various individuals to serve in the church.

I would invite us to remember in this week, women who have influenced our life journeys in diverse and fruitful ways – grandmothers, mothers, aunts, mentors, teachers, sisters, daughters, church and world leaders, friends, and colleagues. I would invite us to share prayers of thanksgiving for them; and if possible, to write them a note, or call them, or text them, and say, "thank you"!
