Christian Exiles Are Fleeing Persecution

Let's help rescue some Exiles! The Deacons at Palm have arranged a partnership with Church World Service (CWS) that will allow all of us to play a role in solving the problem. We will begin by serving as a Hospitality Team for legal, Christian refugees arriving in our area. CWS is one of nine agencies certified by the US State Department to receive refugees. It is difficult not to be distracted by news reports, but it should be noted that it will be another two years before current Syrian exiles can be expected. Meanwhile, we seek to minister to a Brother or Sister from anywhere in the world who has made it through the process and arrives as a stranger in need. Please watch for announcements polling our congregation for specific needs. In the meantime, please include this mission in your prayers. Ask the Lord to guide us and ask how He wills each of us to participate.

GIVE A BLESSING...BE A BLESSING!

Message from Rev. Wanda D. Craner written February 24, 2016

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"My only desire is to make these words reverberate in every corner of your being –'You are the Beloved.'" These words are those of Henri Nouwen, and they are mine for you as well! This will be the final Communitas article that I will write as your Minister of Spiritual Nurture of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference. This week I will make the transition to a new ministry, still focused on prayer, healing, spiritual formation, worship, Gestalt Pastoral Care and spiritual direction. I am excited for how God may shape this ministry in the future, and I also experience some sadness as I will not be seeing some of you as often as I have in the past.

My parting thoughts have to do with blessing. Again, I share words from Henri Nouwen: "To give a blessing is to affirm, to say 'yes' to a person's belovedness. And more than that: to give a blessing creates the reality of which it speaks." I believe our Jewish brothers and sisters understand the power of blessing in ways that many of us have yet to fully understand. I have witnessed the power of blessing as healing hands are laid on those receiving prayer. I have seen the positive shifts in children and young people as a parent begins their day by blessing them, with words like, "Have a good day at school, and remember, I believe in you, I love you... God loves you!" When congregations have sincerely received the benediction (the blessing) at the end of worship, as their Pastor raises his/her hands in a gesture of care and invitation to go out into the world to be a blessing, I have noticed a new light-heartedness, and often, a ray of new hope and conviction.

So, my brothers and sisters: May God bless you with a sense of how very precious you are in God's eyes. May you see every one of your neighbors as God sees them. May you be granted the grace of wise discernment as you make decisions in your individual lives, as well as in your congregational lives. May you move into the future according to God's timing and with the sure of the guidance of the Holy Spirit. May you be given the courage to help all to see themselves as beloved, especially those who daily face isolation, rejection, and injustice. May the creativity of God be among you, so that the faith community of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference may be a witness of compassion and holy truth to the world. God bless you, as you bless others!
