Call for support from the PSEC Disaster Ministries Mission Team



The Disaster Ministries programs of the United Church of Christ are conducted in cooperation with and through the 38 Conferences of our church. When disasters occur in their geographic area, each Conference draws upon the gifts of its local

congregations to determine how to best serve as denominational and ecumenical partners and witnesses of hope. The Pennsylvania Southeast Conference coordinators are Ms. Patricia Kutz and the Rev. Karl Jones. They work with a team of volunteers to help churches and individuals prepare for a crisis. They help organize volunteers for clean-up and rebuilding efforts, as well as participate in response and long term recovery efforts in communities affected by natural disasters.

People and communities impacted by disasters require assistance spiritually, physically, financially, and psychologically. The Office of Disaster Ministries at the national level works to resource faith organizations, individuals related to the religious community, and community organizations.

The resources for this important work come from our taxdeductible gifts to **One Great Hour of Sharing**. As part of Our Churches Wider Mission, One Great Hour of Sharing, is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to



people in 138 countries. The UCC works with international partners to provide sources of clean water and food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, emergency relief, and advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons. OGHS also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response. 100% of designated gifts go to the designated area of response. Non-designated funds are encouraged, because they allow One Great Hour of Sharing to address future hidden and forgotten emergencies around the world.

United Church of Christ selects the Rev. John Dorhauer as Candidate to Become Ninth General Minister and President

The United Church of Christ's General Minister and President Search Committee has identified the Rev. John C. Dorhauer, Conference Minister of the Southwest Conference of the UCC, as the candidate to become the ninth leader of the United Church of Christ.

"John is an articulate visionary who has a deep love for the United Church of Christ and will help us shape the future of the church for years to come," said the Rev. Kent Siladi, Cochair of the Search Committee.

"I am deeply humbled and honored by the trust and confidence placed in me by the Search Committee," Dorhauer said. "I am grateful for the work they have given over the last four-and-a-half months. Taking nothing for granted, I look forward to meeting with the full board in March."



Dorhauer's candidacy must be confirmed first by the United Church of Christ Board of Directors by a two-thirds vote at its upcoming meeting March 19, then by the delegates of the 30th General Synod, meeting in Cleveland June 26-30, with a 60-percent majority.

Dorhauer served as Associate Conference Minister in the Missouri Mid-South Conference for five years prior to being called to the Southwest Conference, and has also served churches in rural Missouri. Dorhauer has a Master of Divinity degree from Eden Theological Seminary and a Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary, where he studied white privilege and its effects on the church.

Friday's announcement concludes a search process set in motion in mid-August, when current General Minister and President the Rev. Geoffrey A. Black announced his plans to retire at the conclusion of General Synod.

"The committee made its decision after careful prayer and intentional deliberation over the past months," said the Rev. Bernard R. Wilson, co-chair of the search committee and chair of the UCC Board of Directors. "We are enthusiastic about his recommendation."
