Brown Bag Lecture at SLHC

Gone FISHing - PSEC Youth Fast to Support Local Food Pantry



St. Andrew's UCC of Perkasie, St. Paul's UCC of Sellersville, & **Trinity UCC of Telford** Youth Fellowship's participated together in "30 Hours of Famine" through World Vision this past weekend February 21-22, 2014. The youth started fasting at 6 am Friday and ending Saturday at Noon. The three youth groups ran a Service Project asking for Food Donations at Landis Supermarket in Perkasie on Friday night for Perkasie's local food pantry "FISH" (<u>F</u>ellowship <u>In Serving H</u>umanity) The youth filled three grocery carts with food donations. Part of the three carts were donations of \$98.00 in cash which enabled the youth group to go into the store and become frugal shoppers to get as much food as they could with the money they collected. They spent an overnighter Friday at St. Paul's UCC, playing Famine games, as well as renewing relationships and spending time together. Saturday they ended the fast with a Break-fast Communion at St. Paul's UCC and traveled to St. Andrew's UCC for Roger Kessler's famous Stromboli at Noon, which has been a tradition for many years.

One of the youth from St. Andrew's posted on Facebook: "Well, another year of 30 hour famine is over and everyone did awesome! Not eating for 30 hours is actually easy when you're surrounded by such a great group of friends working towards a mutual cause of helping to feed those who live each of their days hungry. You don't realize how blessed you are until you are forced to change your lifestyle in order to help those who aren't quite as lucky."

Getting to Know: ARMENIAN MARTYR'S CONG. CHURCH UCC

100 N. Edmonds Avenue, Havertown PA

The Armenian Martyrs' Congregational Church of Philadelphia (UCC), is observing its fiftieth anniversary at its present location in Havertown in 2014. Founded in 1907 by refugees from Ottoman Turkey, the church is the oldest of five Armenian churches in the area. Its name honors the memory of those who perished in the Genocide of 1915, commemorated each year on April 24, a date found on the UCC Desk Calendar. Its UCC connection is through the American Board (Congregationalist) missionaries serving in Asia Minor in the 19th and early 20th centuries.

Aside from generations of descendants of immigrant forebears, Armenian Martyrs' Church includes members from Syria, Lebanon, Irag, Cyprus, Bulgaria, Armenia and Turkey, non-Armenian members from places such as Finland and Kenya, and a number of others who have joined solely because of the welcome of church members. Sunday service is in English and Armenian, there is a weekly Sunday night youth group of 15 to 20 junior and senior high students, a weekly young adult Bible fellowship, as well as monthly men's and women's Bible study groups, a senior fellowship, and a small but high quality choir. Each summer since 2008 the church has gathered nearly 50 children, most from the Armenian community, for a week-long Vacation Bible School. The children and youth go to regional camps and conferences organized by the Armenian Evangelical Union of North America, the other body in its dual affiliation.

In addition to being active in a variety of local missions, such as the men's shelter at Old First Reformed Church and Interfaith Hospitality Network, the church actively supports the worldwide outreach efforts of

the Armenian Missionary Association of America. It has also recently begun a sister church relationship with a small Armenian Evangelical Church in Berd, a border village in northern Armenia.


