#### Palm Sunday Message

Today we stand with Jesus and his disciples at the Mount of Olives, and we look down the road to Jerusalem preparing for our descent into the Holiest week in the life of the church. As we stand at the Mount of Olives and look down the road from Bethpage to Jerusalem, we see two roads. They are both clearly marked--one road is named Palm, the other is named Passion. They are two different roads that begin at the same place and end at the same place but what lies between the beginning and the end is different as night and day.

The road we most often travel on this day is the road called Palm. It is a day in the life of the church where we enter the courts with singing and there are shouts of loud hosannas. It is a day that we celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem where he will be crowned the King of Glory. We celebrate the humility of Jesus, the love of Jesus and all that Jesus stood for as he enters the city gates. Today is a festive day, as well it should be.

This Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday in the life of the church. Passion Sunday leads us straight down the path of the pain and suffering of Jesus Christ. The street named Passion is paved with the blood of Jesus, it is littered with a crown of thorns and the remains of a torn, bloody garment once worn by Christ.

It is very tempting to take the first exit we see off of the street named Passion back to Palm Street. It is tempting for us to find another way around the carnage that waits for us down the road, the carnage we call the cross. Yet we must resist.

The road taken by Christ reminds us of our Christian journeys as well. It would be nice if when God clicked on the GPS for our life's journey that it could be a journey of nothing but straight and well-maintained thoroughfares. It would be nice if we never had to encounter the blind corners of life's unknown, or the road rage of life's cruelty. It would be nice when the road we travel becomes rocky and rough, that we could simply turn off of Passion onto Palm and enjoy a smoother ride.

Today is a day of celebration. But let us be clear as to the source of our celebration. For what we celebrate is the person of Christ: "Who, being in the very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking on the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross."

# Getting to Know:

#### St. Andrew's UCC

1320 Spruce Street, Reading, PA 19602




St. Andrew's Church was organized March 19, 1891, by the Rev. Dr. Benjamin Bausman and members of St. Paul's Memorial Reformed Church. A corner lot at Spruce and Miller Streets in southeast Reading had been purchased in June, 1889, and in November, a cornerstone laid. The first worship service was held in the basement (the plaster was still drying in the church nave) on November 30, 1890, the feast of St. Andrew. By the time the congregation was officially launched, two-thirds of the cost of the building was paid, and arrangements had been made for the first pastor, a recent Lancaster Seminary graduate, to be called.

As a neighborhood church, St. Andrew's has always provided space for community activities. Boy scouts, girl scouts, and campfire girls; voters and poll workers; and GED instructors and students are among those who have been welcomed in the past. For more than a quarter century now, the Living Room Group of Narcotics Anonymous has gathered in the social hall every Wednesday evening. Discipulando las Naciones Church, a non-denominational congregation, has occupied much of the available space in the building for the past several years.

St. Andrew's regularly helps address community needs. We contribute monthly to the East Reading Food Pantry, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, and offer annual gifts to Reading - Berks Habitat for Humanity, which has rehabilitated houses in our neighborhood. We joined with City Reach Church to provide backpacks of school supplies for neighborhood children last fall, donated funds for low-income children to enroll in Reading's summer recreation program, and offered financial support to help City Light Ministries continue their homeless shelter ministry.

The people of St. Andrew's Church took up candy making as a fellowship/fundraising activity in the 1950's. Each year, under the auspices of the Women of St. Andrew's, church, members and friends help support the church's mission by producing homemade, hand-coated candy for the Easter and Christmas holidays.

Two interesting bits of historical trivia: St. Andrew's first pastor, the Rev. Stanley L. Krebs, was originally selected to serve Calvary Church, Reading, as its organizing pastor, but he came down with typhoid fever as he was completing his studies at Lancaster Seminary and had to withdraw from that project. Some months later he had recovered and was chosen to organize St. Andrew's congregation. Rev. Krebs remarried in his later years; his second wife was the Broadway actress Marjorie Main, who after his death went to Hollywood and achieved great fame playing "Ma Kettle" in a series of popular films for Universal Studios.
