Did you know that on average, one UCC congregation closes every two weeks? Did you know that from 2012 to 2015, 111 UCC congregations closed their doors?<sup>1</sup>

Unfortunately, this is happening more and more frequently. This is happening in the PA Southeast Conference. In 1996 there were 205 congregations; today there are 166. This is the reality of church in 2017.

There are so many reasons for this new normal and too many reasons to go into in this article. However, I would like to introduce a resource that can help you and your congregation to discuss and discern the future of your church.

The resource is *Living Legacy*. This is a resource of the United Church of Christ and contains many helpful chapters. It covers the challenges of today's church, discerning the future, options for your building, and legal issues in regards to church dissolution and/or merger. In addition, it contains a wonderful Bible Study for use as a discernment tool.

Who knows what might happen when we come to God with our prayers and concerns; God might just lead us down a path that we never dreamed we would travel. For we are a resurrection people! Where we see death, God sees new life! Where we see nothing, God may see an opportunity to do a new thing!

I want to lift this resource to your congregation and pray that your congregation will begin to discern the future that God has for your congregation. Please speak with your pastor and have a conversation.
