The latest issues of *The Parish Paper* have been posted on the PSEC website under the **RESOURCES** menu. *The Parish Paper* is published monthly by Herb Miller, Lyle E. Schaller and Cynthia Woolever. Each issue offers "ideas and insights for active congregations." The May issue addresses the pros and cons of *Seeking a Bivocational Calling for Pastors and Churches*. The June issue asks "*Could Lack of Curiosity Kill the Church?*" An except from the June issue follows.

#### **Some Curious Questions**

Even while many may still believe the current implication of the phrase curiosity killed the cat, the retort, and satisfaction brought him back, has also gained popularity. This reply takes back the original meaning and highlights the importance of asking curious questions. Below are just a few examples of questions that curious congregations can ask. How will your congregation respond?


- What congregational activities and programs are going well? Why is that the case? What activities and programs do we wish were more effective? Why are they less effective?
- Thinking about your current and previous pastors, what leadership approach seemed to fit your church best? Why do you think that approach was most effective at that time?
- What are the congregation's core values that help explain members' motivations and behaviors? What process is the church using to examine and transform desired values into core values?
- Is our congregation a neighborhood church where most worshipers live nearby or is it a non-geographical congregation, drawing worshipers from a wider area? Why do we believe we are called to serve in this location?
- If our church leaders could travel back in time to twenty years ago, what message would they deliver to those in our congregation? Would those earlier leaders listen and act on that message? Why not?
- Will the passage of time expand or contract our church's attractive options? Why?

Zion's Union Church Maxatawny has a rich history that goes back to our founding in 1826, and we are proud of all that has happened in the past. In November 2013, we entered into a new phase of our history when the ELCA and UCC congregations voted to become one, known as a federated church. Each member now has dual membership in both the wider churches, further emphasizing our Union history as we move forward known simply as Christians. In February 2015, we turned another page in the history books by installing

a new Pastor, The Rev. Jeffrey Butz.

We work together as a group of people who love the Lord by providing programs and activities for all ages. Our Youth Group is very active with a balance of entertaining activities, community outreach, and educational events. One of our popular community activities is a "Live Nativity" that both youth and adults take part in at Christmas. There are social groups for both men and women offering the opportunity for Bible Study, service, and socialization. Both youth and adults take part in many outreach ministries such as serving meals at Opportunity House in Reading and supporting Friend, Inc. in Kutztown.

Adults and seniors are offered an opportunity to gather twice each month for games, including cards and Scrabble, all intended to provide for mind development and fun. The Senior Ministry Group is responsible for a popular newsletter article, The Mystery Senior, with a brief bio so members can identify the person described. This group also sends greeting cards to senior members on memorable occasions and sends a series of four grief booklets to recently bereaved members.

This is just a sampling of the activity inside the church that is highly visible from route 222. Zion's Union Church is a beacon on the hillside in Maxatawny Township. Visitors are always welcome. With God's help we will continue to be "Energized by the Spirit, Humbled by God's Grace, and Working for God's Glory."
