Chester County Migrant Ministries Donations Drive

Since the 1970s, migrant farm workers, and their families, have arrived in the area to harvest a variety of crops. Most of these migrants live and work year-round in the area, and they arrive with very little to their names. Typically, they come unprepared for the colder northern temperatures. In addition, the majority have not learned English, which makes it difficult to ask for help and receive various services. Palm Schwenkfelder Church participates in the annual drive to collect basic necessities. Palm Schwenkfelder Mission Board would like to invite you to participate in our annual drive, from **May 7-14, 2017**. Current needs include:

Health Kits: Toothbrushes/toothpaste, bath towels, wash cloths, disposable razors, soap (Ivory, med. size), pocket mirrors, toilet paper, plastic coffee cups, heavy plastic ware, shaving cream, combs and women's feminine products.

Other items needed: new/used blankets (used blankets must be clean and in good condition), first aid kits, paperbacks, Spanish/English dictionaries, and Bibles. Please place all items at the Migrant Ministry Display by Sunday, May 14, 2017. Furthermore, a list of necessities will be posted on the Mission Board's information center in the Narthex. Thank you for your assistance, as all donations are welcomed and greatly appreciated. "Share your food with the hungry, and give shelter to the homeless. Give clothes to those who need them, and do not hide from relatives who need your help." Isaiah 58:7.

Vision for a new Eastern PA Conference in the UCC

Dear PSEC Friends,

Conference merger. That idea has swirled around both north and south conferences for years. Folks have shared with me reactions that range from "Why are we waiting?" to "Why would we ever?" to "Why should I care?" Leaders in both conferences, who lean forward into the challenges of being church, have taken up this conversation and now invite you to be part of it.

The PSEC Conference Consistory, at their regular March 2017 meeting, entertained a resolution drafted by Consistory representatives of both the Penn Northeast and Southeast Conferences regarding the potential for merger. Like the resolution passed by five northern PSEC Associations prior to the merger that created the Covenant Association, this resolution creates a year-long opportunity to explore the faith, form and function of a consolidated conference. It will come to the floor of the business meeting at our Spring Annual Conference Meeting in June. Friends in PNEC will consider the same resolution at their Annual Conference meeting at the end of April. Obviously, both Conferences will need to approve the resolution for the process to move forward.

Either way, both Conferences have been working collaboratively to share staff resources, create continuing education opportunities and clergy support groups, facilitate Clergy Convocation and Our Ecumenical Ministry efforts. What other dreams and possibilities could we bring into reality that would make us stronger together than we are apart? That conversation excites me and I hope that you will be part of it.
