

How We Feed the Hungry





St Paul's UCC, 1235 Summer Hill road, Auburn, decided as a church wide mission project for 2014 to set a goal of 3000 items to benefit the Schuylkill Haven Food Pantry. Items would include food, paper and cleaning products.

Each month in the church newsletter a list of items is published that members can donate. During the first quarter of 2014 these donations totaled 541 items.

Church members also worked 47.5 hours at the Food Pantry to help prepare and distribute items to 380 families during this time frame.

A "Change for a Change" offering was taken every Sunday in March by children before the children's sermon. Members donated loose coins to this offering. Total collection was \$481.79 which was used to purchase 476 items to be delivered to the Haven Food Pantry in April. While the 3000 goal seemed high at first, St Paul's will have reached over one third of their goal by Easter.

Future fund raisers to benefit the "How We Feed the Hungry" goal are a Midler children's class lemonade stand. The stand will be at St Paul's UCC Sunday School's annual community yard-craft sale, May 3rd. This sale runs from 7 AM to 1 PM.

St Paul's also "Feed the Hungry" at the Pottsville Soup Kitchen by providing the evening meal once a month. Combined worker hours totaled 27.5 and fed 30 individuals at the March meal. March attendance was low due to the bitter cold, but often over 50 people are provided with a hot meal.

Members taking part in the World Vision 30 Hour Famine raised \$857.00 as a mission beyond the immediate area.
