Brown Bag Lecture at Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center

This coming Wednesday, June 8th, come to the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center to hear a presentation by Allen Viehmeyer entitled "David Schultz: Recently Discovered Diaries for 1743 and 1744." Since Andy Berky published the *Journals and Papers of David Shultze* in 1952 and 1953, diaries for 1743 and 1744 have been discovered at the American Antiquarian Society in Worcester, Massachusetts, in 1989. This presentation summarizes what Schultz wrote about his farming activities as well as his record of Schwenkfelders and events near and far in these two unpublished diaries.


