Bethany Children's Home Provides A Brighter Future for Youth News Release dated July 16, 2014

Bethany Children's Home in Womelsdorf, PA is a nonprofit organization that provides residential care for local youth who have been abused or neglected. We strive to provide a safe place of nurture, protection, and supportive care to aid our youth in their self-understanding, growth and healing toward a brighter healthier future. Each year, Bethany serves more than 300 youth from Berks and surrounding counties. This summer we have 60 local youth in our residential program increased from 35 from last summer. The youth we serve have been placed with us primarily through county Children and Youth Service Agencies.

This past year, we have worked diligently to strengthen and diversify our organization to maintain a high level of care and service to our youth. In addition, we have restructured staff to meet the needs of the youth we are serving.

As part of our diversification of services, Bethany was approached to start the Helping Hands program. The goal of Helping Hands is to reunite children with their families in the United States. Most of children coming to Bethany are between 4 and 14 years of age. We provide food, clothing, shelter, medical evaluation, classroom education, recreation, and case management to these youth. We can serve up to 32 children at any time. Their average stay is 10-12 days with Bethany before reuniting with their families. Regardless of their situation, these children are in desperate need of help and we seek to provide them the care they need. The Helping Hands program is separately funded from our residential services program.

Thanks to the increased population of residential youth and the Helping Hands program, Bethany has been able to create more jobs. We strive to maintain a supportive workplace in which we all share a mission to provide brighter futures for children and families. The Bethany Family is in place, and as a team we look forward to continuing with our humanitarian efforts.

Bethany Children's Home residential and shelter care programs are funded by federal, state and local government resources, and philanthropic contributions. Our donor contributions help fund the gap between what is provided by the government and the actual cost of caring for a youth in one of our programs. We are thankful to the many community organizations, businesses, churches and individuals who have provided support to Bethany for 151 years. Through their generosity of time, talent and treasure we have been able to serve thousands of youth in our care. We ensure that their gifts to Bethany are used for the intended purposes they specify.
