Fresh Bread and Other Gifts of Spiritual Nourishment

On this Sunday in many of our churches we will be hearing the Gospel story (John 6:24-35), where Jesus says, "I am the bread of life..." Bread comes in many shapes and forms: bagels, sliced, whole round loaves, long slender loaves, flat pita, tortillas, hot dog and hamburger rolls, sticky buns, and braided loaves. There is whole wheat bread, rye, pumpernickel, multigrain (6, 8 and even 12 grain), rice breads, gluten-free bread, marbled bread, sesame seed bread, oat bread, strawberry bread, to mention only a few. ARE YOU HUNGRY YET?

Fresh Bread and Other Gifts of Spiritual Nourishment is the title of a book written by Joyce Rupp; and the title is also descriptive of some of the ways the Spiritual Life Mission Team develops programming to help enrich the spiritual journeys of our PSEC members and friends. We take time to discern topics of current interest, and then provide various avenues and leaders to help folks reflect on their faith, individually and in community.

As the fall season approaches, there are two retreat events, I'd like to invite your participation. The first is, **Ventures:** An Elder Adult Retreat, "Praying Through the **Ups and Downs of Life,"** September 22-24, 2015. **Ventures** is designed for folks who are young at heart and vibrant in spirit, who may be older in chronological years (participants often range in age from 50 to 90), yet enjoy exploring their faith in a time away with others. **Ventures** includes unique Bible study and worship opportunities, theme presentations, workshops on prayer, movement, and the creative arts. October 23-25, 2015, is: Walking with God, A Spirituality Retreat entitled, "The Beauty of Darkness and Light." This event beginning on Friday evening extending through noon on Sunday, is a time for participants to explore through a variety of means: prayer, worship, experiential activities, quiet time, and light-hearted fellowship, their faith journey related to darkness and light. This year participants will have a special experience of a "Dialogue with the Dark."


