What a great Mid-Atlantic Regional Youth Event this year! Four years ago, I attended as a youth; this year, I attended as a young adult. In many ways, MARYE 2014 was better than MARYE 2010. Worship was much more memorable, the music was phenomenal (between 3 Shades of Blue, Sheltered Reality, and Sacred Dance, my mind was blown), the speakers held my attention and taught me a lot, and the workshops were very informative. Just like last time, I feel that Susquehanna is a great facility for an event like this.

I had the added benefit of experience when packing and getting mentally ready for such an event. But I also had the memories from last time driving me to attend again and to bring more people with me. It's an event that you don't want to miss – no matter what age you are.

I brought my younger cousin along – she enjoyed herself greatly. For me, that was the very best part – to see her react to the event as a newbie. She loved the workshops that allowed her to engage her creative side, while I enjoyed the leadership workshops. The workshops were very well managed and taught at a level that everyone could understand – so much different than in some college classrooms.

I went to support the younger youth because not too long ago, I was in their shoes. I wanted to be reminded of that feeling again. I also attended because I wanted to bring back new ideas to my church. I did this the last time, and my church thoroughly enjoyed the refreshing material (Do you remember the "Everything" Skit?). Between my cousin and me, we are bringing back a lot — a lot of energy, a lot of "we-can-do-this" mentality, a lot of empowerment, a lot of hope that the church is NOT dying, and a lot of new friendships.

For me, I did not really feel a difference in attending as a young adult versus a youth. Some people may view that as a bad thing, but I do not. This event impacted me the same way again even though I am four years older. Yes, this event is posted as a youth event, but I feel that it is just as impactful for the adults. I see MARYE as a multigenerational event. Every part of the event had something for everyone to connect and relate to. Take the theme of the event: "All Pieces Matter". As humans, we often overlook the gifts and talents of others — this event reminded me that EVERYONE has a place in the puzzle, no matter the ethnicity, gender, age, or sexual orientation. God has a purpose for everyone.


