Spreading the Good News in the Digital Age

On Wednesday, August 19, 53 members of PSEC gathered with Rev. Kimberly Knight at the Hampton Inn in Phoenixville to learn how to use social media to complement (not replace) our church ministry. By engaging in conversation with grace and integrity, we add a voice in the digital space that creates a safe space for people who may not be comfortable entering our brick and mortar buildings to learn about our ministry.





An often quoted statistic tells us that 90% of people trust the recommendations of their friends more than advertising. (Only 14% trust advertising.) So, the friends of our members are more likely to connect with our congregations when they read about the mission of our churches on Facebook, than if


they read our building signage or newsletters. Why? Because of the trust factor. If you are my friend, I trust you. So, if you are a part of this church community, I may be able to trust them too.

According to 2015 statistics, members in the Facebook community outnumber the population of China. The digital community is here to stay. Being a member of an online community has its risks, but we can begin by building upon and modifying an existing social media policy (e.g., Community Standards at sojo.net) to maximize our opportunity for diverse communication and outreach for our churches. We can build our online presence over time, beginning with a *good* website (adjusts content for device being used to view, home page contains who we are, where we are, what we stand for, and when we worship, and it is updated frequently). As we expand our strategy and have staff to develop and maintain content, we can add the most recommended social media venues: Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.
