Faith Formation-It's Not Just About Sunday School

"Our role, then, as parents and adults who work with children, is to introduce and support spiritual practices that serve to mix and knead faith into the dough of children's lives."

Karen Marie Yust, "Real Kids, Real Faith: Practices for Nurturing Children's Spiritual Lives"

The lesson that morning in the Grades 1-6 class was the baptism of Jesus. I asked the children if they remembered their own baptism, and received the expected answer of "no", as all of them had been baptized at a very young age. However, they all knew something about their baptism, information like what happened that day, where they were baptized, and how they were baptized. I'm always encouraged when I hear these kinds of things, because that means the adults in these children's lives feel baptism is important and they are talking about it. I hope that means they are also sharing other stories of their faith.

The Faith Formation of a child does not begin and end with Sunday School. While of course this is a significant piece of it, just as significant is how the adults in the life of a child talk about and live out their faith. This is not limited to parents; it's about step-parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles too. If children see their adults taking their faith seriously and doing their best to apply it to all areas of their lives, they can see its importance. If children see their adults attending Sunday School and worship, reading the Bible at home, making time for prayer, and following the example of Jesus, they will see the importance of those things. If adults share their faith stories, children can learn it is not only the people they meet in the Bible who have encounters with God and Jesus, but that people in all times, including today, can meet and experience the Divine. These spiritual practices, along with the practice of Sunday School, are part of what "serve to mix and knead faith into the dough of children's lives."

So, keep up the good work adults! Keep sharing your faith stories, keep bringing your children to Sunday School, and then stay for a class yourself. Keep being an example of what it means to be a person of faith, and keep talking about it with your children. Someday they may just thank you for it.
