Next Sunday We Celebrate American Indian Ministry Sunday

Next Sunday, **September 27**, has been designated as American Indian Ministry Sunday by the United Church of Christ. The United Church of Christ tries, as best we are able, to uplift the variety among us, and to help us be in touch with the unique challenges of our brothers and sisters across the denomination.

I remember as a child walking in newly ploughed fields around my home searching for Indian arrowheads, and I was lucky to find one or two. My uncle was especially interested in American Indian ways and heritage; our family and his would find ourselves gathering annually and sleeping in a full size teepee during a pow wow celebration. My uncle would participate in the dances, as the drummers in a circle would provide the heart beat of movement. Somehow, I too, was drawn to Indian spirituality and culture. It was years later, while investigating my family tree that I learned that my great grandfather was Seneca Iroquois of the Mingo tribe. This fact was a closely guarded secret as my great grandmother had fallen in love with my biological great grandfather, and became pregnant with child - my grandfather. Because of racial prejudice my great grandmother was forbidden to have anymore contact with her Indian suitor. She quietly gave birth, and later married a man who was deemed "acceptable."

For me, the discovery that I was part American Indian was a deep blessing. It was a missing piece of the puzzle of my family history, and perhaps explained why I was curiously drawn to the Indian spirit. At the same time I grieved the prejudice and pain that my great grandmother and my great grandfather must have experienced. I was saddened that my grandfather never had the opportunity to connect with his father. I was pained that skin color and cultural differences created separation, fear, and distrust. I found myself praying for the healing of the generations of my family. I prayed for forgiveness. I prayed for hope and God's grace to move in the present and future generations so that prejudice and injustice would end. I still pray. I thanked God for filling in the missing piece of my heritage.

As we approach American Indian Sunday, I find myself singing the song, "Different is beautiful. God bless variety. Just look around and see...Different is beautiful, beautiful, beautiful...."

On Thu., Sep. 24, Pope Francis will give a historic address to a joint session of the US Congress and visit St. Patrick's Catholic Church and


