












Mission Statement of PALM SCHWENKFELDER CHURCH:

This is the joyful feast of the people of God. Men and women, youth and children, come from the east and the west, from the north and the south, and gather about Christ's table. This table is for all people who wish to



know the presence of Christ and to share in the community of God's people." (UCC Book of Worship)

My travels have been limited to a few countries in Europe and the Middle East and several states in our own country. I've participated in the Sacrament of Holy Communion in many different churches including other denominations, on retreats, mission trips, in people's homes, hospitals, at weddings, conferences and other gatherings. I've partaken of the bread and drank from the cup in as intimate a setting as at sunrise on the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem with a handful of my seminary friends and at the bedside of a dying person whose family wanted to have communion one last time together. I've also received it in as public a place as a mass gathering where I didn't know hardly anyone, and we received the elements in a handy little package that had a small plastic cup filled with grape juice and attached to the top a wafer all sealed together for convenience.

Every place I've participated in this sacred meal, whether I've known the people around me well or not at all, the presence of Christ was made known in the shared bread and wine and through the people gathered around God's Table. We eat this meal together in community with all of God's people in every place and time. On this World Communion Sunday, it's truly a joy to sit at God's Table, eat the broken bread and drink from the cup, and be welcomed with all people everywhere who want to know the presence of Christ. In these few consecrated moments our unity in Christ is revealed to the world.

Getting to Know:

St. Paul's UCC

100 E. Main Street, Ringtown, PA 17967



St. Paul's UCC in Ringtown is situated in the borough of the beautiful Ringtown Valley at the northeastern tip of Schuylkill County.

The congregation was organized in 1822 and shared a place of worship with out Lutheran brothers and sisters. In 1842, both congregations decided to build a larger building to accommodate a growing population. This building is situated outside the borough and still stands today. It is registered with the National Historical Registry, and is known as the "Old White Church." It is used for special worships services. In 1891, St.

Paul's congregation decided to build their own building on the east end of Main Street. With the exception of the Old White Church, St. Paul's building is the oldest original house of worship in Ringtown.

Throughout our history, mission has been our call to ministry. To this day, St. Paul's continues to reach out to the community and far beyond. We host a community luncheon the first Tuesday of each month, support the local food pantry with monetary and non-perishable food items. We also provide "care bags" at Christmas, school supplies for students, informational seminar forums, community ecumenical worships, support country-wide awareness campaigns, Locust Lake ministries, and participate in the Interfaith Health Network. We financially support the Conference and denomination by giving to OCWM, Phoebe Homes, Bethany, and Lancaster Seminary. For many years we have been recognized as a "Five for Five" congregation.

Although we are a small congregation in number, that is the only thing that is small! We have been blessed with much, and we continue to share our blessings.

The Rev. Craig D. Zimmerman, lifelong member of St. Paul's, has lead this congregation for the past 15 years and encourages his members to continue the history of ministry outreach that has blessed St. Paul's
