Does your church have all the money it needs! If so, congratulations, you're doing it right!!

Yet another voice is heard that says "We need to find more members – that would increase giving!" A long term member suggests a letter to the congregation to alert them to the significant shortfall. You sit silently and then...... what do you say or do? Where might you stand concerning their suggestions?
