### Fall General Conference - October 19, 2014

#### Fall General Conference is scheduled for October 19, 2014 5:00 PM following the School of Christ Central Schwenkfelder Church.

On September 23, 2014, Judge Stanley R. Ott of the Montgomery County Orphan's Court signed an Order finalizing the settlement of the dispute between The Schwenkfelder Church and the Perkiomen School. The dispute began August 13, 2010, when the Perkiomen School attempted to unilaterally sever its 118 year relationship with The Schwenkfelder Church. Listed below are the major terms of that settlement:

- 1. Church will no longer have Church-designated trustees on the Board.
- 2. Church will no longer have to approve any Articles or By-Law changes.
- 3. "Founded on Christian principles by The Schwenkfelder Church" reinserted in the Articles.
- 4. Schwenkfelder history reinserted on the website.
- 5. Schwenkfelder Church specifically referenced in Articles as an eligible recipient in the event of the School's dissolution.
- 6. Amendments proposed by the School effecting items 3, 4 or 5 will require approval by the Orphan's Court.
- 7. School to pay The Schwenkfelder Church \$475,000 over a period of three years.

Copies of the Agreement and the Order will be available at the meeting. The events leading to the Mediation with Judge Ott, the Mediation process and the Agreement will be discussed and a vote taken to ratify the terms of the agreement.

Additionally, the Executive Council approved 2015 Budget will be discussed. A light supper will be served following the meeting. Please sign up if you plan to stay for the meal so that Central's Deacons can make appropriate meal arrangements.

For over 150 years, Bethany has striven to provide a safe place of nurture, protection, and supportive care to aid kids in their self-understanding, growth, and healing toward brighter and healthier futures. These children stand at the intersection of so many social justice issues: poverty, violence, access to quality education, and access to both mental and physical healthcare. Bethany also provides "**Safe Spaces**," a support group that offers education, safety, and confidentiality to youth who are growing with their identity as it pertains to current LGBTQ struggles.

There are so many ways our churches can support the mission of Bethany Children's Home. The PSEC Justice & Witness Mission Team would like you to consider some of these opportunities. Invite some of Bethany's youth to visit your congregation or host a mission moment. ## Getting to Know :



St. Luke's UCC

212 Durham Road, Ottsville, PA 18942

In 1976, the congregation of St. Luke's UCC, part of the union congregation with the Lutheran church in Ferndale, PA, undertook to reopen the Red Hill Church in Ottsville which was originally built in 1766. A wing with a nursery, office space and restrooms was built adjoining the sanctuary. The one room schoolhouse on the church property became space for a fellowship hall and

Sunday school classes. Regular Sunday worship has been conducted in the church since Easter 1977.

Each year St. Luke's joins with 3 area UCC churches for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday services. These same four churches hold an Easter Sunrise service at the Marina of Lake Nockamixon. Every February the congregation makes a homecooked dinner to feed the homeless who shelter at Old First Reformed in Philadelphia. Every month on the third Saturday, members of St. Luke's and friends cook and serve breakfast that is offered for the homeless also at Old First.

Congregation members give food items weekly to the Lord's Pantry food cupboard which is a local ministry out of St. John the Baptist RC Church, Ottsville. Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner baskets are also given to Lord's Pantry each year. Every autumn we pack shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. For three years, we have collected eye glasses and sewing kits to send to Swaziland with Swaziland Relief.

The fall and spring rummage sales serve as fund raiser, community service, and mission outreach with many leftover items given to area mission projects. To learn more about our mission, visit our website: **www.saintlukesucc.org**.
