Lay View of 2014 PSEC Spring Meeting Highlights

If you ever have the opportunity to go to a PSEC meeting, by all means GO! I had the privilege to join Pastor Gary and Bob Crouse, consistory member, at the spring meeting May 31. It was held at the beautiful and historic stone Zion Blue Mountain UCC Church in Strausstown....

...In small groups we discussed how to create a "Vibrant Ministry When Money is Low and People are Scarce...." Representatives from three churches presented responses to three challenges. Very impressive was how God led three men from Philadelphia to start a church "in the poorest section of the city," where drugdealing and substance abuse abound. Grace Christian Fellowship established block captains which resulted in 142 new members (52 remain active), conduct door-to-door evangelism, take prayer requests on city corners and even set up drive-thru prayer tents. God led one of the founders to establish drug rehab houses....

Saint James UCC in Havertown, PA saw tremendous growth in their Food Pantry/Bank as needs were published and the congregation responded with donations at Holy Communion, from grocery store "10 for \$10" sales, birthday bags, fresh foods and corporate excess food items.... And Trinity Reformed UCC in Pottstown has focused on youth mission work for eight years. Nearly 30 students with adult supervision have worked at six work sites....

Business was handled very effectively with 267 voting delegates from the seven associations.... Other topics included: Treasurer's Report: Rob Stilwell reported auditors gave the conference "the highest rating possible." Mensch Mill: Michael and Barbara Lenhart were recognized for their work [at Mensch Mill] since 1997.... A highlight, however, of business was the introduction of Rev. William Paul Worley, candidate for Conference Minister, for a candid Q & A session, and subsequent over-whelming election. We sang, prayed, dined and shared ideas. Rev. Worley gave a sermon, and we celebrated Holy Communion.

Most impressive for me was the joy and witness of the Conference leadership team, including outgoing Acting Conference Minister, The Rev. Wanda D. Craner, as they acknowledged letting God lead them in their PSEC roles, responsibilities and activities. It was truly inspirational. I left that balmy Saturday very optimistic for our UCC organization and its goals and efforts to live and promote the Spring Conference's theme: *Together, We Are the Church....* Read the full article online at: psec.org/wp-content/uploads/2014/08/2014SpMtgHighlights.pdf.

Fall General Conference – October 19, 2014

Fall General Conference is scheduled for October 19, 2014 5:00 PM following the School of Christ Central Schwenkfelder Church.

On September 23, 2014, Judge Stanley R. Ott of the Montgomery County Orphan's Court signed an Order finalizing the settlement of the dispute between The Schwenkfelder Church and the Perkiomen School. The dispute began August 13, 2010, when the Perkiomen School attempted to unilaterally sever its 118 year relationship with The Schwenkfelder Church. Listed below are the major terms of that settlement:

- 1. Church will no longer have Church-designated trustees on the Board.
- 2. Church will no longer have to approve any Articles or By-Law changes.
- 3. "Founded on Christian principles by The Schwenkfelder Church" reinserted in the Articles.
- 4. Schwenkfelder history reinserted on the website.
- 5. Schwenkfelder Church specifically referenced in Articles as an eligible recipient in the event of the School's dissolution.
- 6. Amendments proposed by the School effecting items 3, 4 or 5 will require approval by the Orphan's Court.
- 7. School to pay The Schwenkfelder Church \$475,000 over a period of three years.

Copies of the Agreement and the Order will be available at the meeting. The events leading to the Mediation with Judge Ott, the Mediation process and the Agreement will be discussed and a vote taken to ratify the terms of the agreement.

Additionally, the Executive Council approved 2015 Budget will be discussed. A light supper will be served following the meeting. Please sign up if you plan to stay for the meal so that Central's Deacons can make appropriate meal arrangements.
