



Exile Society Annual Fall Meeting & Presentation

The Society of the Descendants of the Schwenkfeldian Exiles will hold their Annual Fall Meeting **today**. The meeting will begin at 2:00pm, followed at 2:30pm by a presentation given by Gregg Perry entitled "Clockmaking in the Style of the PA Dutch (Southeastern PA)." The presentation will focus on construction, materials, surface finish, proportions, and ornamentation of 18th – 19th century Pennsylvania tall case clocks produced by the Pennsylvania Dutch in southeastern PA. A tall case clock in the Heritage Center collection will be visually dissected to extrapolate on all key points. Gregg Perry has been a builder of high end, period 18th century furniture and clock case copies for the past 35 years. For the last 16 years he has been a practicing full-time horologist (a person who makes clocks and timepieces) in his Topton, PA, studio. He has studied two years at the NAWCC School of Horology, one year at the British Horological Institute, attained a graduate certificate from the Louvre in France in wooden artifact conservation, and has been an apprentice in 12 European countries in the last 12 years.

Thoughts on the 4 Association Mergers... "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43).

Four of our seven Conference Associations (East Berks, Heidelberg, Reading, and Schuylkill) have spent the last five years discerning and dreaming about the possibility of consolidating into one Association. And now, on October 30th, Reformation Sunday, they gather to vote on this possibility. While the Conference generally, and the Conference Minister specifically, has not had an active role in these conversations, the Conference Minister does have a perspective to share on behalf of our Conference which will be affected.

First, regardless of the outcome, the merger process has provoked important deliberation around the purpose of Associations (which many don't know), our pastors' and lay leaders' commitment to Association work (which many don't make) and the possibilities that lie in stronger Associations (which most can't see--yet) which make for a stronger Conference.

Second, consolidating Associations has the potential to make an exciting connection with the Vision, Mission and Objectives of the PSEC 2020 Vision Plan even though it was not conceived as part of that plan. It has the potential to create a "unified portion of the Body of Christ moving in a collaborative direction" (vision). It has the potential to make the "Association…agencies of connection and accountability" (mission) and it has the potential to "create an ethos of expectation, experimentation and transformation" (objective).

Finally, it does mean change. Some changes can be anticipated while others cannot. Therein lies cause for anxiety. But the leaders of each Association have given time and space for all voices to inform this process. They understand that as the religious landscape around us changes and UCC ministries near and far continue to decline, business as usual will not lead us into the future. There are new and different ways to structure our connections, share resources, support one another and inspire each other as we live out the truth of being Christ's body and our call to take the gospel into the world. I firmly believe that in this process God may be doing a new thing. That is something of which I want to be part and for which I would beg your prayers.


