Reformation Sunday

Today is Reformation Sunday, a historic day in the life of the church when we remember the Reformers of our faith. Today we remember Martin Luther who in 1517 nailed the 95 Theses on the door of the Chapel at Wittenberg setting into motion the very essence of the reformed movement. In 1518 Ulrich Zwingli courageously rebuked the Catholic Church for the sale of indulgences as a means of a forgiveness of sins. John Calvin, a French Theologian, insisted that worship should include the singing of the Psalms as part of church worship contrary to common practice. What courage these Reformers possessed to boldly challenge the leadership of the church of their day. Their courage changed the world forever. To put it very simply, because of the movement we know as the Reformation, believers have been blessed with a relationship with God that is deeply personal.


It is always good when we stop to reflect where we have been in order to understand where we are going. We are here today because of the courage and risk-taking of Luther, Zwingli, Calvin and others. Let us embrace this part of our past and may we too be inspired to take the same risk and have the same courage when we witness the injustices of our world and yes, even our faith.

What is happening today in our churches that could be thought of as a modern-day Reformation? Are we, as disciples of Jesus Christ, willing to step out in faith, to risk doing a new thing in order to proclaim the Gospel? It is interesting that the United Church of Christ uses the phrase, "God is Still Speaking" as our way of talking about a God that continues to do a new thing. Can you just imagine how the church of 1500 AD would have responded to such a phrase! But in the Reformation, God did do a new thing and God gave birth to our beloved church. And God is still speaking in our midst. God is continually re-forming the church to be the fulfillment of Christ's Body that we were created to be. And God continues to call forward people of faith to serve on God's behalf as agents of change.

Today we celebrate the Reformation of over 500 years ago. It is indeed a reason to celebrate, but if we continue to live in that place, we will miss where God may be calling us in the future. We are living in our time, let us nail our modern-day theses to each of our churches' doors and proclaim, with renewed energy and vitality, that our God lives and is still-speaking. We are not going to rely on the history of our past but take the same courage and risk-taking that the Reformers had and boldly go into the future, knowing that our God will lead us just as God led the church over 500 years ago.

UCC to Retain Ownership of National Offices

After careful consideration, the United Church of Christ has decided to pull the building that has housed the national offices of the UCC the last quarter century off the market, and retain ownership. The sale of the adjoining downtown Cleveland hotel and the land on which it sits, which the church owns, is moving forward as planned.

"I am grateful to the staff and legal team of the United Church of Christ for their professionalism throughout this process," said UCC General Minister and President, the Rev. John Dorhauer. "After considering many options, they have helped us execute a transaction that will enhance our missional focus, free up missional assets, and focus our attention on what matters most."

The hotel buyer, Atlanta-based Global Management, will have a 90-day period to review due diligence of the hotel property and its operations, and a 30-day period thereafter to close the sale.

The current tenants of the 700 Prospect building (which include the covenanted ministries of the UCC, as well as affiliated ministries) are expected to consolidate office space so that new tenants can be sought for the top two floors. More details about consolidating office space and new tenants will be shared when confirmed details are available, Dorhauer said.

The denomination, which relocated to Cleveland from New York in 1989 and staffed in 1990, put the buildings up for sale in February, when property values in the neighborhood soared with the announcement of future redevelopment.
