On Wednesday, November 11th, come to the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center to hear a presentation by Allen Viehmeyer about the Christopher Heebner family. Christopher Heebner (1690-1763), his wife Maria (1693-1768), and their son Hans Christopher Heebner (1718-1804) came to Pennsylvania in 1734. Their daughter Rosina (1713-1790) married and stayed on the Heebner family farm in Lower Harpersdorf. Several letters survive from the father's and daughter's correspondence and form the basis of this presentation. Veterans Day Message

From Rev. William P. Worley, PSEC Conference Minister



Vernon Baker is presented the Medal of Honor by President Bill Clinton on January 13, 1997. Vernon J. Baker, an African American who received the Medal of Honor for his heroic WWII service, is remembered in a painting at the Pentagon. Beneath his picture are these words, "War is the most regrettable proving ground. Those who launch it, and those who seek to create heroes from it, should remember war's legacy. You have to be there to appreciate its horrors — and die to forget them."

Buried deep in the heart of many veterans is the secret hope that his/her war will finally bring about the lasting peace that has been

so elusive in human history; that the sacrifices of so many would make for some permanent change to the way we make space for each other on this earth.

That was the hope that gave rise to Armistice Day -- a celebration of the return of peace after four years of brutal slaughter in European trenches. But what started out as a day of dedication to efforts to make sure that such catastrophes could never happen again has morphed into a militaristic message that it is only armed force that guarantees the future of freedom.

We have a moral obligation as Christians and citizens to demand of our leaders that we find a better way to live together particularly when the outcome of any war or violent conflict has only one certainty and that is the promise of future fighting. We are also morally obligated to recognize the sacrifices of those called to duty and to care for them with the same level of conviction and commitment with which they were sent to war.



Getting to Know :

St. Paul's UCC Grace & Franklin Streets, Pottstown, PA 19464



We gathered for worship at St. Paul's United Church of Christ, are called by God to be disciples of Jesus Christ, faithful to the gospel in all we say and do. In our life together, we will nurture the growth in faith, minister those in

need, reach out with good news, and share the joy of life in God's family, always offering our worship and praise.

St Paul's was founded in 1884 by members of Zions Reformed Church in Pottstown. The first church building was located one block behind Zions and Trinity, at Penn and Walnut Streets. In 1957, we relocated to our current site in Pottstown's north end, which was a "frontier" of sorts, with the help of the Philadelphia Synod. A Christian Education wing was built in 1962, and a new, larger, accessible sanctuary dedicated in 1980.

St Paul's has always been involved in community ministry: serving community meals as part of the Pottstown Cluster of Religious Communities' program; housing local homeless folks for a month each of the last seven winters; in outreach to children and youth through Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and an after-school program. It has been a joy to partner with Trinity Reformed UCC in their annual Mission Week program, and to participate in other community events like the CROP Walk, the Pottstown Relay for Life, and hosting a regular bloodmobile. We extend the hospitality of our building to an AA the Boy Scouts, PFLAG, and Freedom International Worship Center.

Worship is the beginning and the center of our life together. Our worship services are traditional but comfortable. Proudly UCC, we use the New Century Hymnal. Our traditional choir's offerings are complemented by a worship team, musicians on guitar, keyboards and drums, singing and playing more contemporary music.

Our pastor of ten years, Rev. Rebecca Brenner, retired at the beginning of the month, and the church is in a period of discernment about the future, ever seeking God's call to us. To learn more, visit: *StPaulsPottstown.org*.
