UCC Retired Pastor Donates More Than 3000 Christmas Books to Underprivileged Children

Thanks to the generosity of the Rev. Steven Burt, a retired UCC pastor in The Villages, Fla., 3,160 underprivileged children will receive an autographed book of their very own this holiday season. Known as New England's Christmas Story Pastor for his



frequent readings of holiday stories in churches, retirement communities, and on the radio, it's only fitting that Burt should spread joy through his inspirational holiday stories with those who need it most.... Burt donated 3,000 copies of his book, *A Christmas Dozen: Christmas Stories to Warm the Heart*, to the United Way of Marion County's Pajamas and Books for Bedtime initiative, which serves the 5,200 children in central Florida who are homeless, live in transitional housing, or come from low-income families. Each child is given a book and a pair of new pajamas, which are seen as items that provide comfort, Burt said.
