## Did You Know...?

A message from Rev. Wanda D. Craner, Acting Conference Minister

A number of years ago during Advent a friend gifted me with a book entitled <u>Mary Did You Know?</u> that is based on a song with the same title that was written by Mark Lowry. I find the song, as well as the words, to be very powerful. Here are some of the words:

"Mary did you know that your baby boy will one day walk on water?...
Did you know that your baby boy has come to make you new? This child
that you delivered will soon deliver you...

Mary did you know that your baby boy will calm a storm with His hand?... Did you know that your baby boy is Heaven's perfect lamb? This sleeping child you're holding is The Great I Am."

Through Advent-Christmas readings, I suspect that Mary had some sense of the destiny of her son, but certainly not a full understanding. She, like us, needed to watch, and wait, and hope; and actively engage in God's plan.

As a result of our connections with the National Church, as well as the Conference, we are provided with resources which can enrich our active engagement in God's plan. Did you know that you can receive free of charge, *daily devotionals* via the internet from the National UCC? Or, did you know that if you go to the UCC home page and click on *Feed Your Spirit*, you can find spiritual practices, including topics like: Lectio Divina (a special way of reading scripture), Icons, and Prayer Beads? This is in addition to providing avenues for social justice throughout the United States and the world.

Did you know that the PSEC and Penn Northeast Conference have begun sharing some mission and ministry resources? For example, we join in opening opportunities for one another for Christian formation, the Clergy Convocation, the Disaster Response Team, and the Ecumenical Relations Mission Team? We are inviting one another to ministry and mission events across Conference boundaries. And, there are other "grassroots" connections springing up among us, such as, connections between ministers who serve in large church settings. God is doing a new thing! And this, I think, is only the beginning. I really do not know how all of this

will unfold in the future - it is beyond planning. I believe the Spirit is teaching us, and correcting us in these days. Our call is to be listening and watching closely as the Spirit moves.

Clergy colleagues, did you know we are invited to a Ministry Day in the PNEC on Thursday, February 6, 2014 at St. Francis Retreat House, Easton, with keynote speaker: The Rev. Cameron Trimble, Executive Director of the Center for Progressive Renewal? She will help participants to understand and to address the sociological and theological challenges facing congregations today. I hope you will SAVE THE DATE, and join me, and our brothers and sisters in



PNEC. Registration information will be available soon on the PNEC website.

Did you know that God IS with us in these hard times? Did you know that IF we surrender our individual agendas, our plans, our mistakes, our regrets, our limited understandings to God, "all will be well, all manner of things shall be well?" What did baby Jesus' mother know, as she held him in her arms? What do you and I know as we look at the future of the church? More importantly, what does God know?

Trinity United Church of Christ, formerly known as the New Union Lutheran and Reformed Congregation, was established in 1847. Trinity became a UCC congregation in 1959 and continues within the historic tradition of the German Reformation - seeking to serve God and humanity today while looking forward to the future with trust and hope. Our congregation is lead by Pastor Joseph Long.

Bethel, Strausstown, Bernville, Womelsdorf, and Robesonia are towns nearby the town of Rehrersburg. Pottsville, Harrisburg, and Reading are all within a twenty-mile radius. The Trinity church bell and steeple are the oldest west of the Schuylkill River.

Christmas and Easter Programs, Mother's and Father's Day Services, Mid-Week Lenten Soup and Dramas, Christmas Cantata's by both Junior and Senior Choirs. and a Rogation Service "Down on the Farm" are special services held yearly.
