Training for Church Treasurers and Bookkeepers January 21, 2017 - 9:00 am to 12:00 Noon

Since taking on the position of Finance Operations Manager of the PSEC Conference Tammie Wisniewski has fielded many questions from treasurers, bookkeepers, consistory presidents, and pastors that all fall under a "financial" umbrella. Recently, many of you have replied to an online survey asking what types of financial/bookkeeping questions keep you up at night. In the spirit of the New Year and in the effort to ensure that you are doing your work accurately; we are offering you, for a minimal charge, a ½ day workshop with some of the most requested questions and church financial issues that Tammie has answered.

Topics to be covered include but are not limited to, general bookkeep-ing/accounting issues you should understand, what does non-profit mean, budgeting, IRS/federal/state/local tax issues, software opportunities, employee issues, Our Church's Wider Mission, best practices, audit committee responsibilities, how long must you keep those records, and any other questions you may have.

Should my investments on the financial statements show the unearned increases/decreases each month? How long do I have to keep these payroll records? Do I have to give the pastor a 1099 or a W2? If I hold off and pay the insurance bill in January, our prior year statement won't show such a large loss? How does housing allowance work?

Sign up if you are a church treasurer, bookkeeper, consistory president, pastor or anyone who might benefit from this type of knowledge. Although our churches are rarely in audit situations, it makes the most sense to make sure your "books" and records are kept using best practices. Then in the event you are ever questioned by a federal/state/insurance agency, you have the information that they are looking for in a format that will make the inquiry go very smoothly.
